Here's the best IELTS score possible! By practicing with this paper before your actual test, you will be able to familiarize yourself with the size of the paper and the size of the rows you need to write your sentences. This will ensure that you can write clearly and legally on paper. To avoid penalties, you must write 150 words for one and 250-word tasks for two tasks. During the test, you don't have time to calculate the number of words you've written so you want to be able to estimate them quickly.
